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AGM Chairman's Opening Remarks

Good Evening Everyone and welcome along to the Glentinar Community Football Club Annual General Meeting 2024, for those of you that I may not have met I am Jason Shearer, club chairperson.

It's great to see you all this evening and great to be having this back in person after hosting the last 4 years online. Thank you for taking the time to attend.

This year for Glentinar has had its ups and downs, the grass routes football game as a whole across Scotland is changing both on and off the pitch. Paperwork and qualification requirements are becoming more stringent and we are seeing some clubs that are holding 30-40 players across 1 age group and this is harming our ability to recruit. This along with our struggle to recruit volunteers across various ages has meant that we now have the smallest member count that we have seen likely since the creation of the club.

On a positive note we have managed in the last year to achieve many great things - in August 2023 we welcomed Gary and his 2013 blues team to the club, that team have continued to expand and recruit and are now in a very stable position for us moving forward with 2 x 2013 teams for the 9 a side season. We also renewed our Quality Mark status in November 2023 which was a long standing goal for the club, the quality mark symbolises clubs that are not only well respected but credits us for the way we manage our club both on and off the pitch. I would like to thank not just everyone involved in the recertification process but also everyone else at the club who by their continued professionalism allows us this accreditation. One of the stipulations of this accreditation however is coaching qualifications and the minimum requirements at each team, if you are currently coaching but have not yet attended a SFA coaching course or first aid course I strongly encourage that you do this, these courses help guide the future of our youngsters who we may well be travelling to Europe or further afield to watch one day! We have also increased our social media presence thanks to Gary for his efforts with this, this has resulted in more player enquiries to the club overall which shows that as a club we are an attractive place to be. We have also strengthened relationships with the Woodside Sports Complex and Glentinar Juniors committee to be working as a 'one team' approach towards the greater good of the complex, its hoped that these relationships can only get stronger as we move into next year.

We tried in partnership with Aberdeen FC Community Trust to begin a 2017 team in December last year, unfortunately due to lack of players and being unable to recruit volunteers we took the decision in April to close this team down as it was no long viable to run. We will continue to try again this year to increase the number of teams that we have within our portfolio, we are hopeful that with the correct strategy this will be successful. We have also seen the end of what we knew as our original 2009 team after many years of recruitment struggles for both players and coaching staff. My sincere thanks to Fikri for seeing this team through as far as possible and trying his very best with them over the past few years and we of course wish the players all the best for their future playing careers. I am



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pleased to announce though that in the last week we have recruited 3 new coaches and a team of players so that Glentinar can continue with a 2009 age group for the 24/25 season.

We have explored the option of partnering with another club in the city however unfortunately on both occasions the communication with the respective clubs broke down and this will no longer be the case.

We are entering a difficult time for the club moving forward; as I mentioned we have a low member count which in turn reduces income to the club but our bills do not reduce. We are also in a situation whereby we will also unfortunately be saying goodbye tonight to a number of volunteers from the club, these volunteers have unfortunately had to take the decision to stand down due to other personal commitments. The dedication these volunteers have given to the club over the past few years is very much appreciated.

Sebastian Gach will be standing down from our 2011 team this year, Seb has been with the 2011's since the beginning of the team and has taken the lead on the administrative side as well as on the pitch, all the best Seb for the future.

Maja Shearer will also be standing down as Treasurer after the last 3.5 years, unfortunately Maja is now unable to commit the time required to the role and will also be stepping down.

Lindsay Bartlet - Over the last 18 years Lindsay has been the key to Glentinar's success with new teams. There are very little players in those 18 years that haven't started off under Lindsays guidance where he has developed them and allowed the team to continue on to greater success whilst taking a new set of young players under his wing and starting the process over again. Lindsay hasn't just been key on the pitch though, he has also been key off the pitch and has been a long time member of the committee as Development Officer. This has meant that Lindsay was the 'go to' guy for advise on the younger age groups and also kept tabs on each team. There is very seldom we talk about a development team and Lindsay doesn't have his finger on the pulse with exactly what is going on. In a recent email Lindsay said that his pride was when players he has coached approach him in their later years and they still remember him and it got me thinking, what do these players really think of Lindsay, so you can hear it for yourself here. [Video]. Tonight we would like to offer Lindsay life membership of Glentinar Community FC and hope (and I'm sure he won't be) that he won't be a stranger to the club. I'm certainly going to miss walking across the pitch and seeing the famous cap in the distance! We have a small gift for you Lindsay to say thank you for everything and we hope you enjoy your retirement.

David Adams - for those of you who have been around long enough you will know that the club would most likely not be still in business today if it wasn't for David. When I first started coaching at Glentinar 14 years ago I was told that I should just talk to David he will keep you right and I thought to myself "there is no way 1 guy can do everything, right?" - how wrong was I! Throughout the last 20 years David has dedicated thousands and thousands of hours to developing not just young players as a coach but mentoring young coaches, a long



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stint as Club Secretary, treasurer and most recently child wellbeing and protection officer. What David doesn't know about Glentinar is not worth knowing and although the past few years he has been working behind the scenes (not just on his role but helping out with anything and everything!) this is just, if not more important to the success of the club. Even to this day if I am unsure on something or just need a bit of friendly advice David is the first one that I turn to. I think that I have in fact spent more time talking to David some days than I've spent talking to my wife! Although a little harder to track down we also have a couple of messages from some players who David has worked with over the years and how they found their experience with him. [Video] The time has now come for David to take a well earned break from Glentinar CFC to spend time with his family, David has kindly offered to remain available to cover sessions and games if this is required. Tonight we would also like to offer David life membership of Glentinar Community FC along with accepting this small gift as the clubs gratitude to your dedication. p.s. I still might be looking for that advice so don't block my number just yet!

In conclusion we are now entering a critical period for the club whereby although we are only just able to maintain our break even strategy any additional unexpected expenditure has the ability to harm the finances. On top of this with the volunteers above stepping down I have to urge each and every one of you tonight to consider if you or anyone suitable that you know can do any more to assist with the running of the club by joining our committee. I appreciate that everyone already spends a vast amount of their valuable time for the club but should we be unable to form a committee tonight this also brings the future of the club into threat. Thank you for everything that you do for the club and I look forward to working with each and every single one of you in the 24/25 season.

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GLENTANAR COMMUNITY FOOTBALL CLUB Annual Secretary for 23/24 Season

Mr Chairman, Committee Members, Coaches, Guests

Please see below the Glentinar Community Football Club Secretary report for 23/24 season.

Players & Coaches

During the season team affiliations covered mixed age-groups from 2016, 2013 x2, 2011, 2010, 2009.

Unfortunately, we will be losing our 2009 team, although we have now onboarded a new Cove 2009 team.

This will take us back up to 6 affiliated teams for the coming year.

As of July 2024, GCFC has 75+ registered players and 22+ registered coaches with each squad having SFA Level 1.3 representation. There is currently 1 coach at the Club who has a L1.4 Children award and 5 with GK certificates. We also have x2 coaches enrolled on UEFA licences.

All squads have coaches with First Aid, Child Protection and PVG certification and we will continue to support all coaches with the SFYA coach education program. I will very quickly touch on the coaching onboarding process during section 13 just to remind everyone of its importance and show our commitment to child wellbeing / coaches' development.

Certification

The club was awarded Scottish FA Quality Mark Bronze Award in December 2023. A big well done to Dave and Jason on getting the recertification over the line.

Facilities

Alan Wilkie continues to care for the overall ground maintenance at woodside. I feel this maybe a good discussion point in section 13 of the agenda to see if there's any suggestions on how this maybe improved in the coming year.

The current set up at woodside is x2 7 aside, a shared 9/11 aside and x1 11 aside pitches. This will get looked at annually based on the teams we have affiliated.

Indoor lets were utilised again in 23/24 and we used an astro outdoor lets for our 2010s which is a first. This had mixed success with the weather inevitably playing a part.

And the floodlight system continues to get utilised in the winter for teams that require it.

Spond / Comet

Spond continues to be a vital tool for the club with its main purpose of tracking attendance at training / matches for coaches, parents and players. And its key for tracking and pursuing our incoming fees.

And Comet has been introduced by the SYFA. And again, I would like to address this during section 13 and have an open discussion regarding its processes and admin.

Summary

The committee are currently going through a transitional stage with 2 committee members leaving and we are looking at various areas to generate income, including onboarding new teams. I think moving into the new season it will be key to have a stable committee that is committed to the safety of our players and the sustainability of our club. It is very much a team effort so the more volunteers we have the easier it will be to operate the club.

In amongst this we should continue to remember the fundamentals of the club which is to support our coaches and provide them with the tools to make Glentinar fun environment to learn about sportsmanship, enjoy physical activity, learn the importance of teamwork and of course learn, enjoy and hopefully fall in love with the game.

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Treasurer Report for 2023/24 Season

Mr Chairman, Committee Members, Coaches, Guests

Please see below the Treasurer Report for the financial year January to December 2023.

The books for 2023 were closed on 31st December 2023 with £4,328.91 in the bank. The books have not yet been sent for audit however I will look to arrange prior to the handover of the treasurers role.

The total income for the period of January to December 2023 was around £24.5k and expenditure around £28k. There were some higher expenditures due to the increase in costs for certain services, these include around £7k for facilities rent, grass cutting at around £9k and indoor lets at around £4k. Other expenditure remained as expected and totalled £8k.

The main income for this season was in the form of fee's (£19.4k) and Sponsorship (£4.9k)

There was around £1.8k of unrecovered fees in 2023, this would help close the gap between income and expenditure. We should continue to chase the fee collections and the use of Spond will certainly help with this but will need to be kept on a tighter leash.

The club continue to adopt a break-even strategy however rising running costs means we are now running at a loss each month. Having done the budget prediction for the remainder of this year and next year this shows that by early 25 the club balance will be in minus. There are also a couple of considerations worked into the budgeting as follows:

- Assuming no increase in cost of Winter Lets
- Assuming that the number of teams remain the same and there are no losses or increases
- Assuming no increase in referee or affiliation fee's
- No fundraisers being held

I would recommend that to allow the club to move to December 25 and remain in the black with the current member count that the club increase the fee's to £25 and £30 respectively. This small increase allows the club to remain in the black which can be further evaluated at next years AGM should there be an increase in member count.

We have also looked into book keeping services for the club should we be unable to appoint a new treasurer at tonight's AGM. The approximate cost for this would be £118 per month, if this is the case there is a justification to increase the fee's by a further £1.20 to cover the cost of this.

I have enjoyed working with you all over the past 3.5 years and would like to wish the club and you all the very best for the future.

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Child Wellbeing & Protection Report for 2023-24 Season

Mr Chairman, Committee Members, Coaches, Guests

In the 2023/24 season, there were several minor incidents reported which required review. Most of these incidents were from disgruntled parents relating to equity of game time. After informal discussions with parents, these were concluded quickly. In my view, the constitution amendments in 2021-22 outlining the requirement to be competitive in the 11-a-side format has made it much easier to conclude these discussions. However, there were two situations which required more detailed review.

The first situation was an allegation of racism by one team coach against another. The incident was fully investigated, and a report sent to Club committee. My conclusion was that the main issue was a difference of opinion in how to discipline the players which then escalated into inflammatory comments being sent via their Spond system. After review, I was 100% satisfied that there was no racism involved. The result was that the coach who initiated the complaint left the Club. I believe the other coach (against which the complaint was made) acted very responsibly considering the very serious allegation.

The second incident was a report by a coach who was having difficulty with a player who was being disruptive. This situation was complicated for two reasons. Firstly, the player had some attention issues and secondly, the coach had not complied with game time equity and the parents were citing this as a contributing factor. We attempted to resolve the situation by restoring the game time equity but ultimately, in the interests of safety, as CWPO I made the difficult decision to ask the player to leave the Club. We have also taken steps to reinforce the Club policy relating to equity of game time.

At the last AGM, there were plans to introduce a formal disciplinary procedure. Although this document was drafted, it was not formally adopted so has now been finalised and is ready for inclusion in the Club's portfolio. I believe this document will improve transparency and would have helped with the two incidents noted above. The highlights of the document are as follows:

- Standardising the disciplinary reporting process across all teams
- Introduction of a formal YELLOW and RED card process for warnings and suspensions (although an informal process has existed, it is not yet consistent across the Club).
- Clear and concise information to coaches, players and parents regarding the standards and boundaries expected (these are already detailed in the Codes of Conduct but will be re-iterated in a formal policy).
- The consequences of breaches in disciplinary standards (effectively what the yellow and red cards mean).
- Clear guidelines on communication to parents when such breaches occur (clearly explaining when and what occurred and the resulting consequence).

I believe the introduction of this overdue procedure will ultimately improve discipline going forward and will make the standards much clearer to all concerned.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all coaches that if they have any concerns about player safety, both internal to the Club and external e.g. school and home, please raise them immediately to myself as CWPO. Our role at Glentanamore is not to judge or attempt to rectify the situation but to simply report facts



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and subsequently make any report to the relevant authorities as appropriate. I would also like to remind coaches to always remain within CWPO guidelines to avoid putting yourselves at risk. You will know from individual training that one- on-one situations with children should be avoided. This can typically occur due to well-meaning gestures, such as transporting a child home when parents do not turn-up or are late. This should be avoided where possible, so if this becomes an issue, please report to CWPO so that any parents can be contacted as appropriate.

I am happy to report that there have been no reported coach infractions this season. In the past, we have had some coach discipline issues, usually occurring around contentious refereeing decisions. Having no issues is encouraging but to avoid complacency, I'd like to remind all coaches that we must continue to demonstrate the highest possible standards by respecting referees / opponents. and by upholding the standards expected as detailed in our Code of Conduct.

Looking forward to another successful season ahead.
